





## LENT VISUALS REFLECT THEME

The theme for Lent, "Upside Down and Inside Out" is reflected in the visuals you will see at the front of the church on the Sundays leading up to Easter. We will keep these visuals throughout the season because the reality is that growth is usually both quite ordinary and rather slow. Rarely do we change overnight. Things don't have to be spectacular in order to be important. God can and does work in the daily as well as the dramatic!

Purple is the traditional color of Lent, reflecting both the royalty of Christ and a season of penitence and is seen in a variety of shades and textures. The knots in the cloth are something that is created by literally turning the material upside down and inside out.

In addition to the fabric, there are three candles on the table, one for each member of the Trinity. Each Sunday they will be lit in the name of God, who creates life, the Savior who loves life, and the Spirit, who is the fire of life.

As you enter the sanctuary each Sunday and as you listen to the music, the scripture, the readers' theater, and the message, may you reflect on how God is helping you grow. Allow yourself to be remade, reshaped, recasted, and generally turned upside down and inside out.
