WORLD CONFERENCE IN HARRISBURG PA IN 2015

Registration is now open!

You are invited to join your brothers and sisters from around the world in Harrisburg, PA, on July 21-26, 2015, for Mennonite World Conference Assembly. This gathering will not happen again in North America for approximately 30 years, so this is a rare opportunity for us in this area.

The theme is "Walking with God" and each day opens with singing led by a multi-national worship team. Each morning features a stimulating meditation, response by a young adult, fellowship and discussion with a small, multi-cultural group you'll be a part of for the whole week. Each afternoon there are workshops, performances, exhibits, visiting in the Global Church Village, and other events. Evening services include testimonies, prayer, and times of encouragement. Youth and children's programs are also planned.

Mennonite World Conference (MWC) represents part of the global family of Christian churches rooted in the 16th century Radical Reformation in Europe, particularly in the Anabaptist movement. MWC membership includes 101 Mennonite and Brethren in Christ national conferences of churches with 1.2 million baptized believers, and one international association. About 78 percent of baptized believers in MWC member churches are African, Asian or Latin American.

This assembly is "an experience of Jesus we can't fully replicate in our own congregations...a taste of heaven as we worship and fellowship in many languages and cultures" Plan now to attend with your whole family for all or part of the week or support others in their attendance with your donations and prayers.

ADVENT 2014

Oh, That You Would Reveal Your Mystery

Advent may well be one of the most overlooked yet most important times of the year. We live in a culture that depreciates the value of waiting. One sad consequence of this is the increased difficulty we have embracing God's promises that seem so long in coming. We're in danger of losing our ability to yearn for the revelation of God's mystery in our world.



The theme for this Advent-Christmas season strives to add richness to the four Sundays of Advent so they will be filled with edifying anticipation. They call us to prepare our hearts and minds to celebrate the birth of Christ, but they also have us "zoom out" from ancient Bethlehem to see what the birth of Jesus Christ means in God's dream for today.

The Scripture texts from the gospel of Mark draw our attention to the eschatological nature of Advent and help us look forward to the second coming of Christ when the kingdom of God will be on earth, as it is in heaven. This focus has been part of Advent teachings since the fourth century, and we are happy to continue this tradition.

Faithful preparation during Advent puts Christmas into its proper place, not as a comforting destination where chestnuts roast on an open fire, but as the completely disruptive in-breaking of the God who, through this birth, reveals the divine mystery and sheds new light on all things.

Advent proclaims that the days of evil are numbered and that oppressive regimes have only one ultimate future: utter destruction and replacement by God's reign.
