





A YEAR OF OPPORTUNITY FOR.....BIBLE READING



Early last year Pastor Merle and the elders decided to designate 2013 as the "Year of the Bible" for this congregation. We wanted to put a special emphasis on the Bible in several ways. We particularly wanted to provide opportunities to read the Bible and encourage the congregation to engage in the Word in a variety of ways.

One of the most visible ways we encouraged reading the Bible was a public reading in one week at the church. In September, a total of 78 hours was spent with persons volunteering to read the Bible, beginning with Genesis and ending with Revelation. This was well received and several persons encouraged us to do it again. So look for it to happen again.

We also provided insights on Bible memorization, Biblical storytelling and reading the Bible in public.

Acts 29 MINISTRY



“THANKS FOR BEING KIND”

In today's public schools, God has been excluded in many areas. However, one can still teach kindness and the service mentality, as God teaches us. The Curtis & Grammy adventure books feature a secret agent grandmother, who takes her grandson on adventures to help others, while having lots of fun! More importantly, the stories teach children the importance of performing acts of kindness each day, and to encourage the adults around them to join in performing daily acts of kindness.

Through donations from a few businesses, we have been able to reach one kindergarten class at Frost Elementary, the pre-school class at FSU Children's Center, Hope for Hyndman Charter School Kindergarten Class, and South Penn Elementary Kindergarten and Pre-K is scheduled for a January presentation. We have found the kids very excited to keep a kindness journal and to do kindness acts every day.

We are hoping to reach all the kindergarten age children in the county, and any donation amount is so very appreciated. Each child receives a free Curtis & Grammy gift bag with a Curtis & Grammy book, t-shirt, pencil, coloring pages, and an official Curtis & Grammy Kind Kid Card. Each gift bag prepared for a child has a \$25 cost, and every penny that is donated is used to pay for the items in the gift bag.

Everyone was challenged to read the Bible completely within a year. A pamphlet was provided to record your readings throughout the year. Nearly 30 persons picked up those pamphlets, indicating an interest to take up this challenge. We are curious as to how many persons are completing this challenge. Since the challenge was issued towards the end of January, you still have a couple weeks, if necessary, to wrap it up. As you can tell from above, it only takes an average of 78 hours to read the entire Bible. Please let the Pastor know if you completed reading the entire Bible or how near you came.



To encourage you to read the Bible through this coming year, new Bible Reading Plan pamphlets are available on a table in the foyer. In the next week or so, a chart will also be posted on the wall outside the Women's SS class where you can record and share your progress throughout the year. Those chapters you read for Bible Study, SS class or devotions can also be included to help you read though the Bible.

12 Scriptures project

Another project, which was not completed last year, “The Twelve Scriptures Project” is being planned for early this year. We hope to get everyone involved to identify the 12 most important

Scripture texts or stories for our congregation. This process can help to give us clarity on Scriptures that are descriptive of who we are and prescriptive of who we are becoming. Be thinking about your favorite scriptures then be ready to share them when given the opportunity.

The Bible as the Word of God is very important to our faith. We want to continue to focus on it and anticipate what God will show us as we continue to engage His Word.

Recently, things have changed a bit for this ministry with the hiring of a part-time manager, Sheri Speigle. This has resulted in an updated look and feel in the store and with Sheri's energy and innovative nature, a dramatic increase in sales. The highest sales on record were experienced in November with over \$8645. This has enabled the ministry to greatly increase the giving to MCC. As Wayne has said, "This is one of very few businesses who try to make more money so they can give it away!"

 - ◆ Larger groups who can come for 2-3 hours and do some special tasks especially at seasonal transition times or for service projects


