




On Sunday, August 18, the Riddle family was able to be present with us for Sunday morning and afternoon. They offered insights into God's work through them and were able to update the

The Elders and Pastor are hosting a Bible Reading marathon here at the church and are inviting and encouraging everyone to participate. Beginning at 12:00 Noon on Sunday, September 8, and continuing until Saturday evening, a public reading of the entire Bible will take place in the sanctuary.


During this year's focus *The Year of the Bible*, we are encouraging a variety of ways for our church to encounter God's Word, the Bible. **80 Hours with the Word** is a mission to not only **honor our Heavenly Father** by reading His word, but also to help **promote more Bible reading in our community**. Anyone is invited to come and listen to the reading.

This will only be accomplished if the entire church participates. We invite you to read and/or listen to a number of portions of scripture during that week. Please sign up in 1/2 hour time slots on the chart in the foyer to read several times during the week. You may prefer to read favorite books of the Bible, or become more familiar with some books, or have particular times you would like to read.

You may sign up individually, as couples, families, friends, small groups, etc. We also need hosts or listeners for each time slot to listen and follow along, to announce times, to bring water to readers, etc.

Come, dwell in God's Word. Let it wash over you, saturate your mind and heart, and perhaps, change your life.


HOW WILL THIS HAPPEN?

- To start the marathon, each chapter of Genesis will be read by a different reader who is in attendance at the time.
- To complete the marathon, all persons in attendance will read the last few chapters of Revelation in unison.
- Sign up for all the times you would like to read and/or host.
- Readers: You may read from your own preferred Bible translation.
 - You may stand, sit, or walk around as you read.
 - Begin reading where the last reader stopped, at the appointed time.
 - Bring your own beverage to keep mouth, throat, voice refreshed.
 - If more than 1 person is scheduled to read, split reading as you prefer.
- Hosts: Will keep track of time.
 - Bring water to reader if needed.
 - Bring a Bible so you can listen and follow along with reader.
- Listeners: You are encourage to come listen/follow the reading any time.
 - Feel free to come-and-go as you have time.
 - Invite others to come listen with you, in support of readers.
- All Readers and Hosts:
 - Confirmation and reminders of your designated times will be provided.
 - If a problem arises and you can't be there at designated time, try to find a substitute and notify Pastor Merle or Host of changes.
- You are encouraged to come Saturday evening for the completion of the reading in Revelation.



Do not CONFORM
 to the pattern of this world

Wars and rumors of wars, drone attacks, mass shootings—the headlines of the day confirm that violence continues to be our culture's favored reaction to conflict. But the tragic headlines don't tell the whole story. Violence is written into our entertainment, our recreation, our politics. Violence isn't an act or action—it's a worldview that gains adherents through fear and propaganda.

This year for Peace Sunday, we look to Romans 12 for a picture of an alternative worldview, the worldview of peace and reconciliation that Jesus proclaimed. Citizens of God's kingdom seek to love enemies, forego revenge, and overcome evil with good.

The apostle Paul encourages us in Romans: "Do not conform to the pattern of this world." What does it mean not to conform to the pattern of violence so prevalent in our culture and national projection of military power? How can that pattern be overcome by good in our nations, our communities, our homes?

The cycles of violence that yield destruction are birthed by the powers and principalities of the world. God's mission to bring peace and healing in the world relies on communities of men and women being faithful to Jesus and to each other, working for peace in countless ways, large and small. When these communities come together to seek God's will, the world can be transformed.
