



Registrations have been sent in, reservations and plans are being made for Lawrence and Judi Brenneman, Wayne and Roveen Yoder, Merle Christner, Wade Dorsey, and Brianna Flowers. Here is some preparation advice for both those planning to attend and for those of us who will be remaining at home.



The worshipful work of Convention time together requires more than reservations and the financial preparations. For those attending, begin preparing through:

Prayer—Pray for the planners, speakers, presenters and leaders. Pray for the delegates and other attenders. Pray over the agenda and topics that will be covered. Pray for the Phoenix community. Pray for yourself—for an open heart and mind, that you can be attentive to God’s Spirit.

Research—Make yourself aware of the issues and topics for conversation and learning. Check out the study materials through the denomination. If you are a delegate, be sure you understand the perspectives of the group you are representing. Read the delegate materials ahead of time.

Study-- the theme scriptures (Psalm 24:1, Philippians 3:20-21, Romans 5:1-5, Ephesians 2:14-22). Read them!


CHECK IT OUT!



A new series of devotional books have been added to the library. “Seasoned with Peace” Spring, Fall, and Winter are now on the shelves. These are a daily devotional designed to cover a 3 month period, but I often found them interesting enough to just keep reading. They are unique in several ways. First of all, the focus is on “practical help for

becoming a biblical, prayerful, playful peacemaker” and is compiled from many contributors. There are recipes, craft ideas and patterns, photographs, gardening tips, and poetry among the more traditional devotional reflections. If you would like to use it daily, you may have special permission to check it out for three months!

There are also several copies of the books that have been used in recent Wednesday evening Bible studies from the “With the Word” series. These are appropriate for small group or individual study and include daily devotionals. Currently on the shelf are Isaiah, Psalms, Luke, and Matthew.


