Another option is that MCC has opened a personal drawing account (PDA)for us. This account is for our personal expenses like vacation, ice cream, clothing—all things we need to pay for ourselves. You can write checks to MCC and put our names in the memo line and the money will go into our PDA. Contact MCC to confirm the procedure. Also, money gifts (in this format) are not tax deductible.

Yet another option is that you can just give money to our church (Community Mennonite Church in Harrisonburg, Virginia) with "Guatemala Project" in the memo line. This money will help cover unanticipated expenses, give us some funds to work with at Bezaleel school, help pay for child care and Spanish studies for the children, cover our medical costs, etc. This money is tax deductible.

And yet another option is to donate directly to MCC. This will not help us outright, but it will help the agency we work for. And it might be a healthy outlet for your care and concern for the people here and in many other countries where MCC does relief and development work.

## WHAT YOU CAN DO

Paulson and Shirley Kurtz's daughter, Jennifer Murch, along with her husband and children are serving as teachers in Guatemala through MCC. #### Dear friends,

Lots of you have been asking about care packages. Can you send them and how long will it take and what happens when they come through customs. Your concern and care, just in the asking, is hugely encouraging and supportive of us. Thank you!

Here's the deal: right now we are going through culture shock. Everything is new and different and it all (or a lot of it, anyway) rubs the wrong way. This is normal. It is not something to run away from but something to work through.

What we are going through affects you—I need to be aware of that. No one likes to watch someone else flounder about like a fish, and for those of you who know us well, listening and watching without being able to do is a yucky place to be.

By far, the most important thing you can do is just listen and offer encouragement. Your emails and Facebook/blog/twitter comments are HUGELY encouraging. Knowing that you're following along on our journey gives us strength, more so than I thought possible.

But some of you want to do more than that, something concrete, like care packages. I adore care packages, but in the name of honesty, let me be perfectly clear: we don't *need* anything. Almost everything can be found in this country (if you're willing to pay). I mean, Walmart is here (not that we intend the shop there).

Still, if you want to send care packages (and I have no idea how long they will take or what will happen in customs or how much they cost), we will jump all over them.

## 2013 TO BE "YEAR OF THE BIBLE" AT PINTO

Pastor Merle and the elders have decided to designate 2013 as the "Year of the Bible" for this congregation. While we believe that the Bible is essential to our church every year, a special emphasis will be made this year in several ways.



A plan to read the Bible through in its entirety is encouraged with several ways to do that suggested in a flyer you will find on the table in the foyer. Different methods of scripture memorization including Biblical story-telling will be presented as well as Bible quizzing.

We may even take up the challenge of a public reading of the entire Bible in about 80 hours. (If you would like to read how this was accomplished at AMBS, refer to the article at this site <u>http://anabapti.st/files/documents/news-</u> and-publications/11-12/75-hours-with-the-Book.pdf)

Another project that has been suggested by Mennonite Church USA and used in several congregations is "The Twelve Scriptures Project" This has its roots in the Christian Education priority of the church highlighted by Pastor Merle in a recent sermon series. This priority states in part, "The first and highest priority commits us to fashion and mold our lives after that of Jesus Christ. As missional communities, our congregations ... will ensure that people are invited to make a commitment to Christ, discipled in the way of Christ, **taught to engage with the scriptures.....**"

The suggestion is that each congregation engage in a process that would identify the 12 most important Scripture texts or stories for their congregation, answering the question, "Why that one?" These scriptures would not come from the top down--not from the denomination, area conferences or even congregational leadership--bur from the grassroots up. This process can help to give us clarity on Scriptures that are descriptive of who we are and prescriptive of who we are becoming.

The Bible as the Word of God is very important to our faith. We will focus on it in a very specific way and anticipate what God will show us during this year.

## ASHAMED NO MORE..... **LENTEN THEME 2013**

The biblical stories emerge from Eastern cultures where honor and shame are important--to a degree Westerners rarely understand. Personal, family, community, and national honor are of paramount concern. To be shamed



destroys people psychologically and spiritually.

We need salvation from the disgrace we suffer and need to have our honor restored. In the parable of the prodigal son, a key gospel text of this Lent-Easter season, we find old patterns of disgrace and shame are broken.

Christ's shameful death by crucifixion is redeemed by the resurrection. Through Christ our shame is also taken away. God is doing a new thing, recognizing our true nature and making a way for us to become fully human (From The Leader) again.

# THIRTY HEALTH KITS TO MCC

Thirty health kits were recently delivered to the MCC center in Chambersburg, PA, from our church.

Hygiene kits are often presented to displaced people who do not have access to hygiene supplies. Some are given through schools or orphanages to encourage children in healthy habits.

People in such countries as the Democratic People's Republic of Korea (North Korea), Haiti and Bosnia and

Herzegovina have received hygiene kits in the past few years.

Contents include:1 adult -size toothbrush, 1 squeeze-tube toothpaste. 1 large bar bath soap, 1 fingernail clipper, and 1 hand towel. They are distributed in a useful (and colorful) double drawstring cloth bag.



Emily Flowers was a big help in packing and assembling the kits

away from the destructive effect of our misplaced allegiances.

We will hear assurances of God's healing grace, love and forgiveness as we seek to align ourselves with God's restorative purposes in the world.

We will be sent into the world, empowered by God's Spirit to be signs and instruments of God's salvation, justice and peace.
