



TRI-STATE SALE A SUCCESS

The 13th Annual Tri-State Relief Sale is history and most participants from Pinto saw it as a success. Betty Helmick has been in charge of the chicken barbeque for all 13 years and said the booth sold out more completely than it has for some time. A total of 340 chicken halves were barbequed by Springs Mennonite Church and sold as a dinner with sides from our booth. Many helping hands were needed and appreciated to make this a success. Betty has now resigned from this duty to become as she says, "a participant not a facilitator" of the sale. If anyone would like to take on the responsibility for this booth, you may contact the food committee for the sale.



This year, the sale had the use of a new exhibit building on the fairgrounds which was quite clean and roomy, equipped with restrooms and well-lighted. This allowed the Market Place (including books, plants, baked items, and Ten Thousand Villages), Silent Auction, Auction Preview and Main Auction to all be accommodated in one area. Food booths and children's activities were housed elsewhere. Due to construction on the grounds, the Cruise-In car show area was less than desirable and had a smaller attendance. Hopefully, that will improve with the next sale.

Pinto Mennonite Church contributed to the Penny Power collection of the sale in the amount of \$1243 "and change" which is a contribution from many of you when the children pass the baskets once a month during the offering. Thank you!



Several auction items were contributed by those who helped knot comforters on MCC work nights and individuals who donated quilts and other items for the auction and silent auction. Some sold well and others less so, a very common happening for these auctions. An unofficial estimation was a contribution of around \$550 for these items.


"Acts 29" ministry's name is the result of praying, asking the Lord for a name that would raise questions. Since there are only 28 chapters in Acts, we questioned Him ourselves.. After searching the scriptures we discovered that there are three books in the New Testament that do not have an Amen at the close, indicating that there is more to them, still ongoing. Those three books are: James, 3rd John and, of course, Acts.

James was written to the dispersed Jews. It is very obvious today that it is still in action because since 1948, God has been bringing the Jews home to Israel. Ill John was written to the individual Christian and every born again Christian is proof that it too is still an ongoing book. And of course, the book of Acts is the power of the Holy Spirit adding to the Body of Christ daily, hence Acts 29, whose verses are written by the lives of every Christian in this world.

We clearly understand that we are not writing a literal additional book in the Bible. God's Word is complete and perfect just as it is, certainly not requiring the frail hand of man to add to it. 
Cups Held Out by Judith L. Roth Illustrated by Brooke Rothshank

ALLEGHENY CONFERENCE TO MAKE MAJOR DECISIONS

The Conference meetings to take place at Laurelville on August 5-7 will include many familiar elements of worship, delegate sessions, reporting, seminars, recreation, and fellowship. Ervin Stutzman, Executive Director of Mennonite Church USA, is the guest speaker for the worship sessions on the theme of "Investing in Hope" from John 20:19-23.

Two major votes will be taken by delegates to the Allegheny Mennonite Conference at Laurelville on August 5-7. These are to amend the constitution of the conference in a major way to revise the entire structure of the conference and to affirm the search committee's selection of a full-time conference minister.

The restructuring (or "remodeling" as it has been called) has been a work in progress for several years and has involved countless hours of discussion and discernment. The Coordinating Council is bringing the following motion to be affirmed by a 2/3 majority vote by the delegates:

Coordinating Council moves that the current "CONSTITUTION OF THE ALLEGHENY MENNONITE CONFERENCE" be replaced with the "BYLAWS OF THE ALLEGHENY MENNONITE CONFERENCE" and the "Allegheny Mennonite Conference Organization" to become effective August 7, 2011.

If you have questions about this change, there is information available on the conference website or you are encouraged to speak to one of the delegates.


As a part of remodeling, it was decided at the last delegate meeting, to search for a full-time conference minister. Donna Mast of Scottdale, PA, has been serving in a half-time capacity since the resignation of Kurt Horst. The search committee interviewed several strong candidates and has unanimously approved the recommendation that Donna Mast be employed as our full-time Conference Minister for a three-year term. This will be voted on by paper ballot and a 2/3 majority vote will be needed to affirm her for this role.

Whether or not you are able to attend, you are invited to be in prayer for the delegates before and during August 6.
