



#### ADVENT: "FREEDOM BOUND"


The Advent season is a time of reflection on how God's coming in Jesus releases us from personal, social, and historical chains that bind us. The theme for this Advent-Epiphany season is "Freedom Bound."

We live in the paradox that we are both bound and free, on a march to

by the burden and sin we carry: we are carrying the scars of struggle but living with a new hope. God's freedom takes us down pathways of justice, mercy, trust, love, service and inclusion. "Make me to know your ways.

O Lord; teach me your paths" (Psalm 25:4).

Whether from imprisonment in Roman jails (Paul's letters), or from exile in Babylon (the context of the prophets), or from the secondclass citizenship of Jews in first century

Palestine ruled by Rome (the gospels), our Advent-Epiphany Scriptures speak to us of people struggling to live in difficult political, social, and personal situations.

These Scriptures confront us. Just as the biblical prophets addressed their own people's sin with a message of judgment, mercy, and hope, so also these texts address us and call us to conversion. Our lives, neighbors, church, and family members are touched by class inequity, the lack of resources that lead the vulnerable to slide into deep poverty, and racial injustice.

"Freedom Bound," this worship resource for Advent-Epiphany, invites us to see with bifocal vision: to have one eye on ourselves and the world and another eye on the Scriptural stories that, with the Spirit's help, can enliven and deepen our faith. Advent is typically seen as a season of waiting, but with all that God has yet to do through us we cannot be satisfied with a passive waiting. Our waiting is active, full of energy, lamenting, mindful of suffering, and hope-filled. Advent is a time set aside for spiritual renewal, a time to develop a more robust and resilient faith.
